During Chicago Calling, Chicago-based artists showcases performances and projects that involve collaborations with artists living in other locations - here in the U.S. and in other countries worldwide. The collaborations between Chicago-based artists and those living elsewhere are prepared, improvised, or a combination of both. For instance, a Chicago-based poet is collaborating with a musician from Niger, and a Chicago-based performance ensemble is collaborating with a composer in New York. first Chicago Calling event begins at 12:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 25, and the final event ends at 11:59 p.m. on that day.

October 25, 2006 was chosen as the date of Chicago Calling to commemorate Pablo Picasso's birthday.
